Alejandro Flores, GEC, updated on research and review of statistical conditions. He explained logistics and details of the project, including sidewalks and that it would be in phases.

1.Seabrook Bridge Boat Launch: Brent French with DEI prepared study with Seabrook Bridge Boat Launch (Only public boat launch in the city of NOLA). As part of study, he met with Comm Hebert. She expressed some desires for boat launch area: proposed playground area, proposed additional vehicle parking (15 new car spots), driveway underneath bridge for additional boat parking, proposed overflow parking lot at contractor laydown area (everything outside of Flood Protection area) *early conceptual draft

Rehabilitation of removal and replacement: \$800,000-\$1million

Jim Martin, DEI, Phase IV of Erosion Control Project – explained details of project,2450 ft of asphalt (half mile) pathway, suggesting this phase be bid into two bid packages

Lake Terrace Parkway Seawall

- 1) Mr. Rainey wanted to bring up floating docks, floating finger piers and the benefits of it. Concerned with DEI using old guidelines from 1980's. Floating docks ought to be considered *point from Mr. Rainey
- 2) Mr. Chais Sweat, President of Lakeshore POA, asked about how long DEI worked on design. Concerned with why not having vehicular traffic behind there.
- 3) Ms. Ann Duffy, President of Lake Oaks, concerned about existing roadway that was closed with bollards. Why was it closed? Was it because of Corps of Engineers?
- 4) Mr. Ray Landeche, resident of Lakeshore Drive, concerned with limited parking of only 50 spaces.
- 5) Monte Shalett inquired about areas that need to be completely replaced.

Kristi Trail, Executive Director of LPBF, idea of drinking water fountain. A friend passed away 9 months ago who was an avid cycle runner and unfortunately killed while outside. Looking for a way to honor Mr. Johnson, own and lease land from Non-Flood, will be outside of their fence line. Wishes to have approval from Rec/Sub to move forward with specs and plans for the public drinking fountain. Approval of conceptual design, will be on city water, sounds like nice amenity (Rodger stated), Rec comm suggested LPBF come back with a sketch/design, right to explore further. Seek endorsement to move forward with plans, will conceptualize plan further.

Grant conceptual approval, subject to drawings.
